20.	POLICE ISSUES UPDATE	<ul> <li>All to note that:-</li> <li>A new Police Community Support Officer will be joining the Thurncourt team, but PC Ben Orton is leaving the team.</li> <li>The Police computer cannot generate crime</li> </ul>

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		figures for just the Thurncourt Ward, but crime has reduced by 11% across Leicester as a whole.
		<ul> <li>Posters are available from the Police indicating whether a household is willing to participate in Trick or Treat.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>It is useful if details of bikes used in crimes can be provided when such crimes are reported to the Police.</li> </ul>
		<ul> <li>Lighting for the ball court had been approved, but the court needed to be resurfaced before it can be installed.</li> </ul>
		As the forthcoming weeks will be busy for the Police, (for example, due to Halloween and Bonfire Night), unless it is an emergency members of the public are requested to use the 101telephone number to contact the Police.
		Residents are reminded to ensure that their property is secure when leaving it. This includes leaving lights on, where possible.
