1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for Unit 22, 33 Cank Street and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 6 January 2014 from Mr Kalpesh Ruparell for a new premises licence for Unit 22, 33 Cank Street, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section P of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Live Music

- 7.1 The Live Music Act 2012 has amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of live music. Unamplified live music does not require a licence between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. Amplified music may be provided between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day if:
 - it is provided in a premises licensed and open for the sale of alcohol, to an audience of not more than 200 people; or
 - it is provided in a premises that is not licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 (other than solely for late night refreshment) but that is a workplace, to an audience of not more than 200 people.
- 7.2 The above exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live music provided in the circumstances described above. However, if problems do occur as a result of live music then conditions may be imposed to control that music following the formal review process.

8. Representation

8.1 A representation was received on 15 January 2014 from Leicestershire Police. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. Leicestershire Police are concerned that the premises is situated between two very busy areas and will attract through traffic. Leicestershire Police have contacted the applicant to request additional conditions to be applied to the licence A copy of the representation and agreement is attached is attached at Appendix B1.

8.2 Another representation was received on 6 February 2014 from a member of the public. The representation relates to prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that the unit is sited at the arched gateway to St Martins and is worried that groups of people will congregate in this area. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix B2.

9. Conditions

9.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.





Thank you for your help earlier today in clearing up the fact that you thought February 3rd was the closing date and February 6th is correct.

I hereby object to the licensing application for Unit 22 Cank Street, St Martins LE1 5BG.

The location of the unit is sited at the arched gateway to St Martins shopping centre. The three main doors of the unit open out into the covered passage way, clearly all inevitable groups of smokers will utilise this cover and if any application for outside seating is applied for it will restrict the flow of pedestrians even more, especially as I regularly see the police emergency attending the St Martins venue Canvas with various public safety issues.

I would also be interested to learn about the intended opening hours, which are not clear in section 'L' eg. what time is 24:00 and if this means midnight then what does 00:00 refer to?

The archway is the major access to an eclectic mix of shops, Pizza Express and Ask, busy family and children party focussed venues and given my knowledge, grounded in 24 years of being in the vicinity, I know that the possible safety/smoking/language issues would impact greatly. For example with The Market Tavern and Square Bar, we have already had to suffer these same disturbances which are on record with yourselves, the police and the court.

I have already reported a venue called Canvas, within St Martins, which

is impacting with anti social behaviour and noise pollution, to the police. I am also led to believe that the police have already objected to this application, having insisted on door presence and adjustments to opening hours.

In reference to section 'M' part 'd' on Mr Ruparell's application form, I notice his plan was to "Carry out risk assessment to determine the potential effect on neighbouring premises and take necessary steps" This afternoon, at the eleventh hour, Mr Ruparell arrived at The Case and asked for a meeting. The application also includes live entertainment, which apparently will be background music. We have recently had the joy of flats revitalising the old Nat West bank just outside St Martins. If others wish to turn the volume up, what's to stop them? The concept of a 20's cocktail bar is appealing, however, it's not the concept that is my grievance, it is the location and how it will if granted create a barrier to the family feel. The unit also has no ability for cooking and is therefore totally alcohol focussed.

Further to this objection, I would ask that the police and the city council should be looking at the saturation of licensed venues within our area as the present legislation for our city is out of date due to the changing dynamics.

Summary

33 Cank St, a 1920's vintage cocktail bar showcasing premium cocktails (both alcoholic and non-alcoholic), local and craft bottles beers and a selection of fine wines. Food will be served throughout service, ranging from complimentary canapés, bar snacks and sharing platters. With jazz and soul music and the availability of table service, we aim to create a relaxed feel and experience for our customers.

The layout, small occupancy, premium products and service itself will appeal to people that we are trying to encourage back into the city centre. The food offering will encourage customers to eat whilst drinking and where table service is available complimentary water will be automatically be offered and kept replenished.

This will be my first venture as an entrepreneur after 12 years of managing bars and restaurants in the UK and Australia, please see Appendix A for a character reference from my current employer. I consider this to be my vocation will be personally investing £75k into funding this start-up project.

In order to meet the licencing objective I will be taking steps as outlined in my application and in addition to this have agreed to implement the recommendations made by PC TJ Mavani. Appendix B shows a layout drawing with proposed CCTV, which would provide additional recordings currently not covered by city centre CCTV.

In specific relation to objections made by Mr David Hartshorn of the Case Restaurant & Champagne Bar I would like to propose additional steps to promote the prevention of crime and disorder and of public nuisance by the addition of a gated terrace space.

The facia of the building will feature window boxes and hanging baskets to create a welcoming entranceway to the St. Martins scheme.

33 Cank St will revitalise a listed building that has sadly been empty for over 4 yrs., creating up to 5 jobs.

My venue will add to the independent feel that makes the city centre unique and will be a great addition to St Martins, this is supported overwhelming by existing tenants (Appendix D).

Terrace Space & additional steps

The unit currently has two Entrance/Exit doors (Appendix B & C), the Cank Street entrance will be used by customers, who will not be able to gain entry or exit from the St. Martins doorway. I would like to propose the creation of a outside seating terrace please refer to Appendix C. This terrace will be formed by a series of portable "interlocking gates", which can be set out specifically during trading hours. These gates will feature a design in keeping with the façade of the building. They will also serve a dual purpose, as they will be internally secured to all doorways and windows of the building to provide additional security after close. The terrace will run to the length of the building and being 1.5m in width, represents less that a third of the total size of the St. Martins archway access. I have had discussions with the landlords, who are happy with this proposal and are satisfied this will not impact on the thoroughfare for pedestrians and shoppers into St. Martins.

This proposal will mean that we can have tighter control on customers entering and leaving the venue which is in clear view and close proximity to the serving area, and the creation of a designated outside area, which will prevent overspill into the archway.

I have also begun the process of personally gaining a SIA door supervision licence.




