Traffic Issues along Hastings Road, Victoria Road East and the junction between Victoria Road East and Gypsy Lane had caused a number of accidents. ACTION: Highways Officer to investigate concerns.

TRANSFORMING NEIGHBOURHOOD S SCHEME	 The Community Engagement Officer reported that the council was reviewing the way local services operated in the North East of the City which included the community facilities in the following wards: Troon, Rushey Mead, Belgrave, Humberstone/Hamilton and Thurncourt ward. It was noted that 1200 responses had been received for the initial consultation in June/July and from that a set of proposals had been developed which the council was now putting out for further consultation.
