# Application for a review of an existing premises licence Euro Market, 33 Narborough Road, Leicester, LE3 0LE

#### Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

#### 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

#### 2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
  - Reject the review application
  - Modify the conditions of the licence
  - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
  - Remove the designated premises supervisor
  - Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
  - Revoke the licence
- 2.2 Where Members take the decision to reject the review application, they are permitted to issue an informal warning to the licence holder and / or recommend improvement within a particular period of time.

## 3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a review of an existing premises licence for Euro Market and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

#### 6. Review application

- An application was received on 24<sup>th</sup> June 2019 from Leicester City Council's Licensing Enforcement Team for a review of the existing premises licence for Euro Market. The application was made on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 6.2 The Licensing Enforcement Team are concerned that the DPS has been committing the offence of selling cigarettes and tobacco without paying the full UK Excise duty, which makes it easier for children to start smoking, takes advantage of cash strapped families and helps funds crime. This also relates to Public Safety and Protection of Children from harm as there is no control on the quality of the tobacco and could contain harmful substances.
- 6.3 The Licensing Enforcement Team have submitted additional information in support of their application. This includes photos, HM Revenue & Customs witness statements and Companies House information.

#### 7 Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

7.1 In arriving at its decision on the review application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.
