Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representation(s), Members must consider whether to
 - Reject the review application
 - Modify the conditions of the licence
 - Exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence
 - Remove the designated premises supervisor
 - Suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months
 - Revoke the licence
- 2.2 Where Members take the decision to reject the review application, they are permitted to issue an informal warning to the licence holder and / or recommend improvement within a particular period of time.

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a review of an existing premises licence for The Yellow Door and summarises the representation(s) received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

6. Review application

- 6.1 An application was received on 27th June 2019 from Leicestershire Police for a review of the existing premises licence for The Yellow Door. The application was made on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.
- 6.2 Leicestershire Police is concerned that there have been numerous incidents of crime and disorder related to the premises and that the venue has failed to take steps to uphold the licensing objectives and keep the public safe.

7. Representations

- 7.1 A representation was received on 22nd July 2019 from a member of the public. The representation is in support of the premises who wishes to praise the response of the staff working the Yellow Door when he was assaulted in a nearby premises. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C1.
- 7.2 A representation was received on 25th July 2019 from the Noise Team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise Team have had previous dealings with the premises in relation to noise nuisances in the last year. Whilst no new nuisance has been recorded since May 2019 the Noise Team would like to request that a condition is added to the premises licence requiring all amplified music be played through a noise limiting device set at a level agreed with the Noise and Pollution team. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C2.

8 Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

8.1 In arriving at its decision on the review application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.
