- Team Manager, 5 EHO's and 1.6 FTE Enforcement Officers.
- We regulate a wide range of regulatory legislation governing public safety.

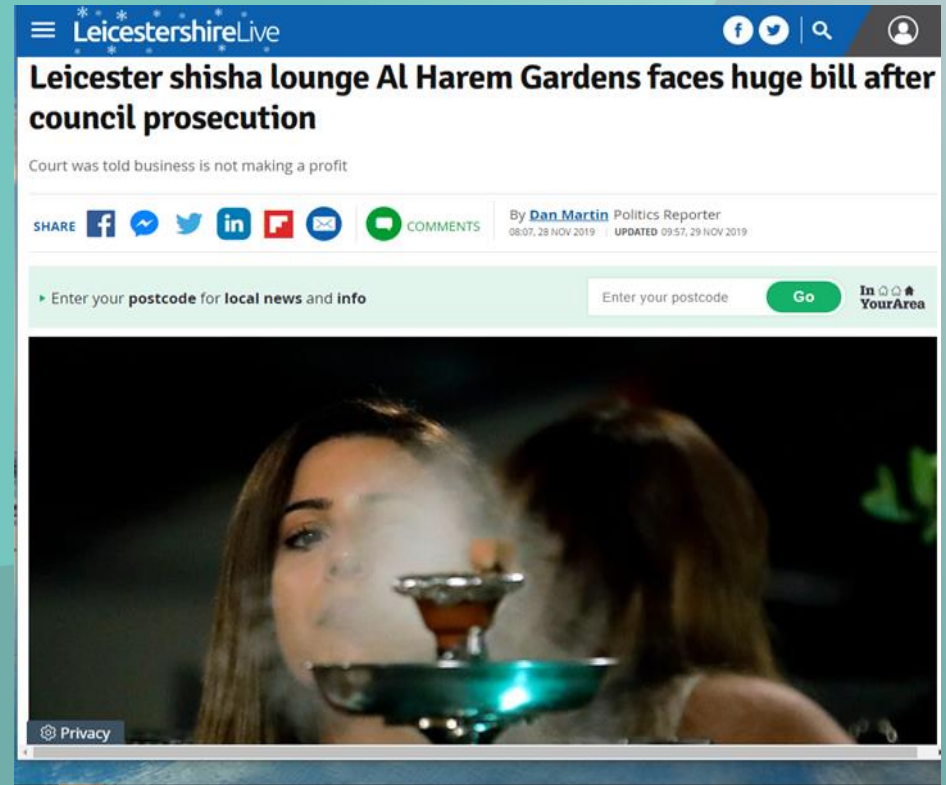
Illegal Tattooist

- Working from his bedroom
- Not registered with LCC
- Successful prosecution
- All equipment seized
- 300 hours community service
- LCC awarded full costs £3260



Shisha Café

- Allowing smoking in an enclosed area
- Dangerous electrics
- HMRC seized 14.74kg of non-duty paid shisha tobacco to the value of £2,214.54
- Business fined £11,897.50
- Full costs awarded to LCC £2597.50.



2020/21 Inspections

- All high-risk premises will receive a full inspection.
- B2 and C rated businesses will receive an intervention.

Proposed projects for 2020/21

- Petrol Stations – Full inspections
- Nail bars – Public safety visits with Police, Immigration and HMRC officer
- Event Safety – Provide advice and carry out monitoring of large events.
- Sports Grounds Safety – Implement the Team's revised Enforcement Policy. Carry out routine monitoring. Issue risk based safety certificates. Upload certificates and supporting documents onto Resilience Direct Portal.

Proposed projects for 2020/21

- Shisha Premises – Continue smokefree compliance visits.
- Defibrillators – Joint project with PH colleagues
- HSE Priorities – The HSE direct local authorities on sectors/activities that require an intervention based on national data/trends/accident records.
- Public Health – Implement enforcement policy for scratchers.

2020/21 Likely Resourcing Issues

- Significant increase in new businesses
- Event safety – More regular and larger events
- Kasabian concert – Will require significant input
- Westlife/Little Mix Concerts - Planned by Cricket Club this year will also require significant input
- Change in resources within the team
