1. Purpose of Report


1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for 7 Days Supermarket and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.



5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 17th August 2020 from Ako Salih for a new premises licence for 7 Days Supermarket. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The application is as follows:

Licensable activity	Proposed Hours
Supply of Alcohol	Monday to Sunday 08:00-00:00
Opening hours	Monday to Sunday 08:00-00:00

6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

7. Representation

7.1 Four representations were received during the representation period. One from a ward councillor and three from local residents. The representations relate to the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. They are concerned that if the premises is permitted to close at midnight this will be later than other licensed premises in the area and may attract disorder and nuisance to the area. A copy of the representations is attached at Appendix B1-4.

8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix C.

9. Statutory Guidance
