Application for a variation of an existing premises licence Vitaz Superstore, 66 Canon Street, Leicester, LE4 6NG

Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Modify the conditions of the licence
 - Reject the whole application

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a variation to an existing premises licence for the Vitaz Superstore and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

6. Application

6.1 An application was received on 2nd March 2021 from Greenhill Consultancy on behalf of Vijaykumar Hingu, the premises licence holder, for a variation to an existing premises licence for the Vitaz Superstore. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix B.

7. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 7.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix B and existing licence at Appendix A).
- 7.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

8. Representations

- 8.1 A representation was received on 6th March 2021 from a ward councillor. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance the protection of children from harm, the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety. Councillor Solanki is concerned that if the application is granted it would cause disruption to nearby residences and the increase to hours would exacerbate the existing issues of street drinking, noise, litter and general anti-social behaviour in the area. In addition, there are concerns about elderly and young residents in the area as this is a main route for residents walking to schools and places of worship. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C1.
- 8.2 Representations have been received from a local resident and a local temple who also submitted photographs. The representations relate to the prevention of public nuisance, public safety, the prevention of harm to children and crime and disorder. They are jointly concerned that customers leaving late at night and the early hours will increase the already unacceptable noise levels and disruption that currently exists and increase anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of the premises. There is also concerns about urinating in the street. The existing litter problems, street drinking and gatherings will also be likely to increase into the early hours if the application is granted. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix C2 -C3 and the photographs at C3.
- 8.3 A representation was received on 22nd March 2021 from the noise team within Leicester City Council. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise team are concerned that if the hours are increased in line with the application there will be an increase in noise and disturbance from vehicles, stereos, car doors slamming and talking into the early hours and this will impact on the lives of local residents and likely increase noise complaints in the area. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C4.
- 8.4 A representation was received on 22nd March 2021 from the Leicestershire Police. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public

nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm.

The police are concerned that if the application is granted there will be an increase in noise levels, litter, street drinkers and anti-social behaviour. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix C5.

On the 24th March 2021 additional information was received from the Leicestershire Police whereby they submitted information on other local premises in the area and reported incidences. This is attached at Appendix C5 (photos and info).

On the 25th of March a further statement was received from Leicestershire police as indicated on the original representation. This is also attached at Appendix C5 (statement).

- 8.5 Discussions have taken place between the applicant's representative, the applicant and the Local Beat Officer PC Martin Rawlings about the potential to amend the hours of application to Midnight every night. A verbal agreement was made at the meeting however no formal written agreement has been made and therefore the application before you is as originally applied for.
- 8.6 The applicant's representative has submitted a signed petition which is in support of the application. This is attached at C6 to the report.

9. Conditions

9 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule are attached at Appendix D. There are no conditions consistent with either the noise team or the police' representation as both have recommended refusal.

10. Statutory Guidance
