### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- b) an ultraviolet feature.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The licence holder shall ensure that a CCTV system is installed and implemented. The CCTV will be retained for a minimum of 28 days and made available wihin 24 hours of a request being made by a relevant authority.

A member of staff will be present at all times whilst the premises is open to the public, who is trained to operate the CCTV system.

All staff training on Licensing Act 2003 and safeguarding issues will be refreshed every 12 months and a written training log will remain on the premises and be produced to the relevant authorities upon a request being made.

A refusal and incident book will be kept on the premises, this will be updated accordingly and produced to the relevant authorities upon a request being made.

The licence holder shall ensure that bins aren't emptied before the shop opens or after it closes.

The licence holder shall display Challenge 21 posters. Acceptance of accredited 'proof of age' cards and/or passport or driving licence with photograph.







In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience
  does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

The premises, known as Vitaz Superstore is a licensed retail store located within a residential area on Canon Street and Harrison Road, Leicester.

In the main, the area is typically a residential area, although there are few other non-residential uses scattered along the road.

The applicant has applied for the sale of alcohol 06:00 – 00:00 hours Sunday – Thursday and 06:00 – 02:00 hours Friday and Saturday.

During the daytime, road traffic, commercial activity and on-street activity would be considered to be the dominant noise source in the locality. However, later in the evening, after 23.00 hours non-residential uses are generally closed and therefore into the early hours of the morning traffic noise and street noise noticeably reduces.

There are residential properties adjoining Vitaz Superstore, on both Canon Street and Harrison Road.

I am concerned that noise nuisance from raised voices and general activities associated with a typical licenced premises would be detrimental to adjoining residential units. The adjoining residential units would be exposed to noise from the commercial unit which would be transmitted through the fabric of the building and through any open doors and windows.

Local flats and houses do not include acoustic glazing sufficient to mitigate such noise levels, nor additional ventilation that permits windows to remain closed. Consequently, during late at night and early hours of the morning, noise from raised voices, could prevent the normal and reasonable use of local properties.

The premises currently, has a premises licence to sell alcohol from 07.00 hours till 23:00 hours Monday - Sunday.

The Noise Team is concerned that increasing the opening hours of the store for the sale of alcohol will increase pedestrian and vehicular activity in the area, which will increase the likelihood of noise complaint and disturbance to local residents.

Noise from customer activity, noise from vehicles (doors slamming, stereo systems etc.) when parked outside the premises or parked on the quieter local streets throughout the night would be very difficult if not impossible for the applicant to control.

It is therefore recommended that the application for variation of the premises licence be refused as applied for due to potential noise disturbances to local residents.

The premises itself is situated on the junction of Canon Street and Harrison Road. To either side of the premises are adjoining residential dwelling houses, there are also other commercial buildings and dwelling houses within the immediate vicinity of the said venue.

Directly opposite the shop is another convenience store (Gokani).

Leicestershire police are concerned that the present application fails to promote the following licensing objectives.

- i. Prevention of Crime and Disorder.
- ii. Public Safety.
- iii. Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The issues we have with this application are as follows.

- 1. Due to the close proximity the premises is to local residential dwelling houses and flats, the police are very concerned that should this establishment be permitted to remain open into the early hours of the morning with their proposed operating hours, this could lead to unacceptable noise levels that will be generated by their customers, especially due to the fact that some of them could be already intoxicated and just looking for a premises where they can top up and continue drinking, also if this was the case then there would be an increased chance of bouts of disorder breaking out.
- The area already suffers from a problem with street drinkers and the
  associated issues that they are connected to, such as noise, litter and AntiSocial Behaviour (ASB). The last thing we want is people purchasing alcohol
  at all hours, then congregating in the area causing problems for the local
  community.
- 3. I have spoken to the applicant's advisor and he indicated that the applicant is now trying to capture passing trade from people who are employed at the nearby businesses once they finish work. If this was to happen, this too could cause issues for the local community as the proposed customers will more than likely be pulling up in vehicles and just leaving them near the road junction coupled with the fact that there would also be noise generated from these vehicles such as the opening and closing of doors and the sound of engines being started.

Due to the concerns highlighted above, Leicestershire Police would request that in order to promote the licensing objectives of Prevention Of Crime And Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention Of Public Nuisance that this application be refused.



Please note several incidents relating to drinking in the street past the 1100pm time and in to the early hours of the morning. Additionally I would also add that I visited the shop at approximately 1400 pm on Wednesday the 24<sup>th</sup> of March 2021 and spoke to Sandip Mohanial who was serving customers. As I entered the store I noticed him serving and engaging with a customer who was not wearing a face mask. I challenged the customer and Mr Mohanial re the current legislation on the wearing of face masks inside Off Licenses. Mr Mohanial had little English speaking abilities however I then spoke to the License Holder later that afternoon and expressed my concerns that staff members were not enforcing the legislation and consequently not adhering to the objective, to have consideration for Public Safety. The LH was warned about the none compliance and this was recorded on Police systems, and that if further breaches were seen then Penalty Notices would be issued.

In summary I am concerned that this LH wants the facility to serve alcohol until the early hours of the morning and do not accept his proposal. I believe the impact on the local community would not be a positive one and in fact there would be an increase on demand for the Police dues to the increase in reports of Anti-Social behaviour that would inevitably be a result of longer hours of operation and ability to sell alcohol. The Belgrave area has always been linked to a culture of local males drinking in the street and with this habit comes other issues, such as noise, and urinating in the street causing alarm to concerned residents. In particular there is an aging population in the area and I believe that there will be further disruption to their lives.
