Members will recall that the revenue budget for 2021/22 and medium term financial plan to 2024/25, includes a £500k efficiency savings target. The table below summarises the efficiency savings which have been agreed with the Chief Constable. It is anticipated that £506k savings will be delivered in 2021/22 with ongoing savings of £501k from 2022/23.

Non-pay savings of £200k in relation to hotel accommodation, stationary and travel costs are expected to continue as Covid lockdown begins to ease, mainly due to the continuation of virtual meetings.

Slippage in the 2020/21 Capital Programme will reduce the cost of debt charges by £115k in 2021/22 and therefore, the minimum revenue provision that must be set aside to fund debt repayment. Finally, it is intended to deliver further savings in relation to vacancy management for police staff. This will not result in any staff redundancies and care will be taken to ensure no detrimental impact on service outcomes. A summary of the key findings is attached for ease of reference. It is encouraging to see within the profiles, that Leicestershire Police compares well with its most similar Forces and others nationally, regarding the cost per head of population and other relative efficiency measures.
