Councillors seek views on city libraries

CITY councillors are asking Leicester people to help to shape the future of the city's library service .

Members of the council's culture and leisure scrutiny task and finish group want library users and non-users to take part in a survey which aims to find out their views on libraries and how they could be improved.

Cllr Wayne Naylor, chair of the task group said: "We want everyone to have their say on city libraries so that we can create a new vision for the future of the library service."

"We are already visiting libraries and speaking to staff and users to find their views. And now we want as many people as possible to complete the survey forms and give us a wider picture of how people would like to see the service develop".

Information gathered through the survey will feed into the development of a new public library strategy, which will set the direction of the service for the next 5 - 10 years.

Survey forms are available at all 18 city libraries until Tuesday 23rd October. They can also be downloaded from the council's web site at www.leicester.gov.uk/libraries
