Our application proposes to extend the terminal hour for all licensable activities on Wednesday to Saturday until 3am the following day with closing at 3.30am. This extension of hours is to allow the premises greater flexibility around trading and the extra hours would allow our customers to continue their night in a safe & comfortable environment and to enjoy what the premises has to offer.

We are seeking the additional non-standard timing for all licensable activities and opening hours to the standard and non-standard times on the day when British Summertime commences to allow the premises to remain open and trade legally when the clocks change automatically from 1am Sunday morning to 2am. The proposal for the provision of films is for including but not limited to amplified music videos, sports, and TV programs

Prior to submitting the application, we consulted favourably with Jeff Pritchard from Leicestershire Police. We have also consulted with Annette Bryan the Team Manager of the Noise and Pollution Control Team who has confirmed she has no issues with the proposed extended hours.

Considering the above, we believe that the variation would not have an adverse impact on the licensing objectives and we believe that the measures proposed will ensure the premises continue to promote the licensing objectives, and that these measures are adequate and further conditions are not required.

 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

ANNEXES

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supplied alcohol), or
 - drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a b) particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over c) a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- a) a holographic mark, or
- an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person shall ensure that-

where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint:

- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

All external doors and windows must be kept closed, except for access and egress, in all rooms when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

A noise limiting device shall be installed, fitted and maintained in such a manner as to control all sources of amplified music at the premises. The limiter shall be set at a level in agreement with the Licensing Authority. Once set such a device should be inaccessible to the licence holder or her staff.

Prominent, clear notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.




