The Local Plan on how the land in the city would be used for housing, residential and employment needs recently went to the meeting of the Full Council. The final consultation on the plan would start in January 2023. The plan consisted of 39400 new dwellings, and 23 hectors of land would be located from the county to support the dwellings. Plans were to optimise brown fields. With 71% on brown fields and 29% on green fields.
