
Aylestone Ward

Possible Planting Suggestions

Below are the suggestions that we have received to date, together with initial comments from the Council's tree experts. In some instances further consultation will be required, for example with local residents if a proposal involves planting trees right outside of houses, or with our highways officers if a proposal involves planting trees close to a major road.

But we now welcome your views on the suggestions below (shown on map overleaf). Do you support these proposals? Do you have any particular preferences? We would like to begin planting at preferred locations this planting season and/or carry out any further consultation. We will keep you informed of progress.
