Please summarise your concerns about this application:
<p>This is an application for both off and on sales in premises where many homes are nearby, including a house that shares a party wall – yet no measures except CCTV are proposed to promote the licensing objectives.</p> <p>I am also concerned as to how this application relates to the other one at these premises for a street café. Noise from people outside is much more difficult to control, and more disturbing to a wider number of residents.</p> <p>I also feel that licensing should not be used to change the character of the premises and gain more than the planning permission allows.</p>



**Please give further details of why you believe this application will have an adverse effect on the licensing objectives**

I have no objection in principle to the off-sales at these premises as an adjunct to other food/drink sales. However as children will be regular visitors to the shop, particular measures need to be taken to prevent under-age sales/theft. This especially so since the applicant indicated during the planning process that there would be free food/drink tasting throughout the premises.

It is not clear which area they intend for off-sales? The cellar is shown on the plans as part of the premises though labelled as a store. **I would object to the cellar being licensed** as this would increase the proportion of alcohol sales and be 'hidden'.

The premises shares a party wall with a house and is in a dense housing area that already suffers noise problems from a wide range of sources. It is not suitable for more than a minimal amount of licensed café, indeed I could argue it is not suitable at all. The area shown to be 'on-licensed' is different from that designated in the planning permission, which made it quite clear this is not an A3, A4 or A5 premises. This indicates a disregard for agreed conditions which is worrying in licensed premises, **and the 'on' licensed area should be restricted to that allowed by planning.**

**Alcohol should only be served with food** – in line with the applicants stated intention in their planning application

I am puzzled also by the plans for a street café to 11pm - later hours than this application, which might indicate an intention to change the nature of the premises, or to allow customers to eat/drink previously bought items outside after the shop has closed. Outdoor noise is difficult to control and can disturb widely. There have been examples of this at other premises locally –including the applicants adjoining premises where noise from their unauthorised smoking area reached my home, as can noise from people congregating outside the bars. There is also potential, in a residential area where youngsters may be out unaccompanied, that they may get hold of unfinished drinks left out on tables. I know this to have happened elsewhere.

**I ask for a condition that alcohol should only be drunk indoors, neither on nor off sales being drunk in any outdoor areas managed by the premises.**

I don't object to the video, but ask that **conditions be applied to control noise levels to protect the adjoining residents.**

Also I feel the **starting hour is too early for 'on' sales and video** because of the shared party wall with a house.
