A FEW OF THE SUCCESSES FROM THE FIRST ACTION PLAN...

- More than 500 privately owned homes retrofitted
- Over 2300 energy saving measures in council homes
- Over £24m Salix investment into schools and operational estate







£1.17m grants 205 businesses c1500t carbon















Replacement of 116 diesel buses with EVs in progress, saving 2,053 tCO2e per year

Electrified Park & Ride and Hospital Hopper services

Hop! electric shuttle launched

Tap-on, tap-off bus ticketing system

Bikeability training for 3,220 pupils

Over 8km new cycling routes

Tree Wardens scheme launched, alongside existing Leicester Environmental Volunteers





THEMES

AREAS OF FOCUS

The council	Operational buildings, new construction, fleet, procurement, resilience
Housing	Fuel poverty, council housing retrofit, private rented via discretionary licensing, owner occupied via govt. funding
Business, public services and community	Council's commercial rented property, SMEs, schools and young people, collaboration across public sector
Transport	Local Transport Decarbonisation Plan, active travel, buses, EV chargers, new/smart technologies, push for rail improvements
Land and infrastructure	Local Plan, Biodiversity Net Gain, flooding, energy infrastructure
Consumption and waste	Waste Strategy, recycling service improvements, council waste, awareness of lower carbon dietary choices/options
Actions supporting the whole plan	Communications, training, community and government engagement, partnership development, widening funding, adaptation updated risk assessment and review

86 new and ongoing actions including...

- Net Zero Delivery Plan for council's estate and operations, and £1.26M further investment
- Low carbon developments at Stocking Farm, Dock 3-5, Pilot House, Leicester Market
- Fuel Poverty Programme, Home Upgrade Grants and Warm Homes Surveys

- Waste Strategy
- Recycling in Business Centres
- Flood alleviation projects
- EV Transition and Infrastructure Strategy
