

<b>1. STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:</b>	<ul> <li>Put forward medium-term strategic priorities for each thematic area, to offer a bridge between pledged actions in the plan and the long-term strategic vision.</li> </ul>
2. SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT CO-BENEFITS:	<ul> <li>Go further to systematically identify co-benefits linked to the Sustainable Development agenda, in particular health and addressing inequalities.</li> </ul>
3. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:	<ul> <li>Develop a strategic approach to engaging businesses, organisations and citizens to support achievement of the Climate Emergency Action Plan.</li> </ul>
4. CAPACITY BUILDING:	<ul> <li>Ensure LCC staff and partner organisations are aware of the Climate Action Plan and have appropriate knowledge on how to support this.</li> </ul>
