Appendix 1 - Planning and Licensing Update

Late Night Food Premises in Evington Shopping Centre: Planning and Licensing Controls

Background and Current Position

Councillors Raffiq Moosa Mohammed, Yasmin Surti and Manjula Sood have expressed concerns relating to opening of businesses late after 11pm which has adverse impact on the residential amenity of local residents in the Evington Road shopping centre.

Initial investigations have confirmed around 60 premises which have uses relating to food and have the potential to open late in the centre.

In response, Cllr Elly Cutkelvin, the Executive Member of the Council responsible for oversight of Planning and Neighbourhood Services, has commissioned a report on the concerns, current position and potential actions from planning, licensing and other relevant council services which have some form of oversight or control of the uses concerned.

The Officer review and recommendations of potential options for consideration is currently being finalised for consideration by the Council's Executive

Next Steps

Following the presentation and consideration of the report by the Executive, proposed actions will be communicated to local Councillors, interested residents and stakeholders.
