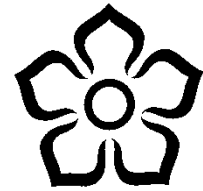

Appendix 1 - Highways Actions

- Wyngate Drive shops - 8 bollards installed to try to stop driving along the footway.
- Ainsdale Road area - 20 mph scheme in force from 15th May including speed hump on Kingsdale Road, bollards on corner of Kingsdale Road as well as Wynfield Road
- New Parks Way – joint sealing done September, cost £5k.
- Glenfield Road traffic calming measures carried out / further work review – separate Cllr / residents meeting being arranged for this.
- Braunstone Frith Primary school and Frolesworth Road 20mph schemes - Both are in the program and public consultation will take place in due course.
- Stokes Drive 20mph scheme includes part of Western Ward with Birkenshaw Road – awaiting executive decision report sign off.
- Perth Avenue footway works starting on Monday 20th November – estimated cost £73k.
- Golf Course Lane railway bridge carriageway resurfacing, possibly other parts of GFL as well, potentially happening this financial year.

Appendix 2 – Housing Update

Anti-social behavior

Since May 2023 the role of dealing with anti-social behavior has now been taken on by the Community Safety Team (CST) lead by Caroline Green.

Housing Officers will no longer deal with any anti-social behavior case work, they will refer cases on to the CST. All cases held by the Housing Officers were passed over in August 2023.

Staffing

Due to the Community Safety Team taken anti-social behavior, the Housing Officer Posts were reduced, and the New Parks Housing Team have been reduced from 6 to 5. Currently we are not seeing a lot of reduction in work loads though.

Cleaning in the Aikman Avenue Flats (The Burns Flats)

The Councilors and Jo Randall at the New Parks Hub received several complaints about the standard of cleaning in these flats. A site visit was carried out which also included the Cleaning Supervisor and the Manager. The Cleansing Manager has produced a briefing for the Councilors around proposals for improvements in the cleaning and costs, this is still under review, in the meantime Housing Officers are carrying out daily checks to ensure the cleaning is being carried out as per the specification. A further meeting is to be set with the Councilors and Jo Randall.

Environmental Projects

Over the next month Housing Officers will start to look at ideas for projects for 2024/25. There are some projects that, although submitted last year, had to be put on hold due to the reduction in funding for the Environmental Budget. These will be submitted again this year, but we are always looking for new ideas that benefit the tenants in the area.
