CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE
The bar will be in possession of a tango Victor Radio and we will be working closely with the local authorities to help prevent crime and disorder in the area.
There are CCTV cameras installed all over the venue
The bar is in possession of several first aid kits to help with any first aid matters.
The bar has been fitted with a multiple zone fire alarm system.
There will always be first aid trained personnel present at the bar.
There are multiple fire extinguishers throughout the venue.
The DPS will take precautions to safeguard children at times where children are present. Minors will not be accepted into the venue after 2100. After 2100 Door staff will be carrying out ID checks on anyone who looks under the age of 25. If a minor does attempt to enter after 2100 then the DPS will contact the local authorities for guidance on how to handle the situation.
CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE REPRESENTATION AND AGREEMENT FROM THE POLICE
The licence holder will ensure all licensable activities cease no later than 3:30am.
The licence holder will ensure customers are not permitted to enter or re-enter the premises after 3am, except for those customers using the rear enclosed courtyard adjoining New Walk.
The licence holder will ensure customers/members of the public are not permitted to use the rear fire exit onto New Walk (via the enclosed courtyard) unless in an emergency.
The licence holder will ensure no customers/members of the public remain on the premises between 4am and 8am.
The licence holder will ensure customers are not permitted to smoke/vape and/or consume drinks supplied by the premises outside the front of the premises on King Street, unless during the hours permitted to so by a valid Leicester City Council street café pavement licence.
The licence holder will ensure customers are not permitted to access and/or consume drinks supplied by the premises upon the first/ second floor of the building.
The licence holder will ensure a minimum of one Security Industry Authority (SIA) front line door supervisor must be on duty on Friday and Saturday from 10pm and remain on the premises until the premises closes to the public.

<p>The licence holder will complete a monthly security review and if necessary and/or if directed in writing by Leicestershire Police Licensing Department, employ additional Security Industry Authority (SIA) front line door supervisors at the premises.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure all Security Industry Authority (SIA) door supervisor(s) used at the premises record their full name, full SIA registration number and the dates/time deployed at the premises. A record must be kept on the premises for six months and made available for inspection to an officer from a responsible authority upon request.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure the premises is a member of Leicester City Watch and possess an operational Leicester City Watch radio when open to the public.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure that at least one operational audio and visual body worn camera is deployed at the premises and worn by either a member of security staff or staff whilst the premises is open to the public after 10pm until closed to the public.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure body worn camera footage in both an audio and visual format is retained for a minimum of 31 days and made available to an officer from a responsible authority within seven days of a request.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure a high-definition resolution, coloured CCTV system is installed, operational and recording whilst the premises is open to the public. The system must permit the identification of individuals in all lighting conditions. Cameras must cover all areas that the public have access to, including the entrance/exit, the enclosed rear courtyard and the pavement area immediately outside the front of the premises.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure CCTV images are securely stored, display an accurate date/time stamp (BST/GMT) and retained for a minimum of 31 days.</p>
<p>A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public and alcohol is on sale to the public between 10pm and closing to the public. This staff member must be able to show an officer from a responsible authority data/footage with the minimum delay when requested.</p>
<p>The licence holder will ensure that viewable CCTV images are provided in a downloadable format to an officer from a responsible authority within seven days of a request.</p>
<p>An incident and refusals log will be kept on the premises and retained for a period of 12 months from the date of the incident. The log will be made immediately available for inspection on request of an officer from a responsible authority. The incident log must be completed within 24 hours of the incident and record the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">(a) All crimes reported to the premises.(b) Any ejections of patrons.(c) Any complaints received concerning crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour.(d) Any incidents of crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour associated to the premises.

- (e) Any faults in the CCTV system.
- (f) Any refusal of age restricted products.

A Challenge 25 policy will be adopted with the only acceptable proof of age identification consisting of a current passport, photo card driving licence or identification carrying a PASS logo. A training record must be kept on the premises, retained for twelve months and produced to an officer from a responsible authority upon request.

The licence holder will promote and ensure that all front of house staff and Security Industry Authority (SIA) door supervisors employed at the premises are trained in public safety campaigns such as "Ask for Angela" or other similar schemes. A record of training must be retained for at least twelve months, repeated every six months, kept on the premises and made available for inspection by an officer from a responsible authority upon request.

The licence holder shall take reasonable steps to prevent public nuisance being caused by customers outside the premises and display prominent notices requesting customers respect the needs of residents and leave the area quietly.

The licence holder will ensure no person under the age of 18 years will be permitted to remain on the premises after 9pm.

CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE REPRESENTATION AND AGREEMENT FROM THE NOISE TEAM

Installation of a noise limiting device and the level to be set and agreed by the Noise and Pollution Team

Receiving of deliveries must only be conducted between 07:00hrs and 22:00hrs.

Emptying, dispensing, or disposing of bottles in outside bins must only be conducted between 07:00hrs and 22:00hrs.

Keeping all external doors shut except for access and egress, in all the rooms involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

All licensable activity pertaining to live music and recorded music to cease by 3:30am Monday -Sunday.
