1. Summary

1.1 This report outlines an application under the Licensing Act 2003 for a new premises licence for Baton Rouge at Queens, Orton Square, 41 Rutland Street, Leicester LE1 and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives and the relevant parts of both the statutory guidance and the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1 Having considered the application and representation(s), Members must consider whether to
 - Grant the licence without modification
 - Grant the licence subject to conditions
 - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
 - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
 - Reject the application


3. Application and promotion of the licensing objectives

- 3.1 An application was received on 11 April 2024 from Baton Rouge@41 Ltd for a new premises licence for Baton Rouge at Queens, Orton Square, 41 Rutland Street, Leicester LE1 1RG. Additional information from the applicant was received on 3rd May 2024. This has been circulated prior to the representation period end date. A copy of the application and additional information is attached at Appendix A.
- 3.2 The application is as follows:

- 3.3 The premise previously had a licence with opening hours which mirror this application but with no regulated entertainment.
- 3.4 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section M of Appendix A).
- 3.5 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

4. Representation(s)

- 4.1 Eleven representations have been received between 12 April 2024 and 3 May 2024 from members of the public. The representations relate to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm. The residents are concerned that the proposed hours of opening and licensable activities will lead to noise, litter and disruption for local residents and that the late hours may encourage people to loiter in the area leading to criminal and antisocial behaviour. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix B1 to B11.
- 4.2 A representation was received on 30 April 2024 from the Licensing Enforcement team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance, public safety, the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. An agreement was reached between the applicant and the Enforcement team. A copy of the representation/agreement is attached at Appendix B12.
- 4.3 A representation was received on the 29th April 2024 from the Leicester City Council Noise Team. The representation relates to the prevention of public nuisance. An agreement was reached between the applicant and the Noise Team. A copy of the representation/agreement is attached at Appendix B13.

5. Conditions

- 5.1 The conditions that are consistent with the application and the representations and agreements are attached at Appendix C.
- 5.2 The Live Music Act 2012 and the Legislative Reform (Entertainment Licensing) Order 2014 amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of regulated entertainment. Certain entertainment does not require a licence subject to audience limits, between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. These exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live or recorded music that is unregulated. However, if problems do occur as a result of that entertainment, then conditions may be imposed to control such music in the future after a formal review.
