It is a busy road leading into town and other central parts of the city and is regularly in use by the public, especially those coming from Thurmaston and south Hamilton. 2. Although there’s a school and there’s traffic associated with it, but there’s no evidence to suggest that the safety has been an issue so far. If you have some data points to prove it otherwise, then please do share. Additionally, during school run time there’s always a Lollipop Lady to guide and manage crossing. 3. 20 miles of speed are not enforceable unless speed cameras are in place. There’s no evidence to suggest that a police speed camera is either required or feasible (expense wise) to be installed on that stretch. <p>Therefore, as discussed with the residents the sides streets should be prioritised for 20mph while the main arterial Catherine</p>

	<p>Street must remain at 30mph to enable continuous smooth flow of traffic, which also prevents emission concentration due to slow moving or tailed back vehicles.</p> <p>You are requested to amend the problems regarding the junction at Cannon St and Catherine St, since as it stands, it is a very difficult and dangerous crossroad, which is prone to accidents. To improve the safety of the junction, traffic lights and perhaps a mini roundabout would be beneficial.”</p>
