Appendix 1 – Highways Update

Highways Update and Upcoming Works

Highways Maintenance Works

We continue to routinely inspect the footways and carriageways around the ward either 2 or 4 times per year and in the last 12 months have found actionable defects and issued repair orders as follows:

- Carriageway 321 orders
- Footway 376 orders

We carried out two emergency concrete bay repairs / replacements on Frolesworth Road and New Parks Boulevard

Road Safety

We are looking at options for possible improvements to Glenfield Road from New Parks Way to Woodville Road. We had a residents meeting at New College on Dec 6th and a follow up is planned in May. These are single issue meetings on traffic matters in addition to the wide-ranging ward meetings. Ward councilors have been fully involved.

Flooding & Drainage

Currently there are no flooding or drainage issues that we are aware of in the ward.

School Streets

Sustrans are supporting Christ the King Schools, Dovelands and Forest Lodge schools in cycling and walking to school, which includes an element of road safety training. Living Streets are supporting Christ the King Infant and Dovelands in a Park and Stride and recently held an event to promote it.

A school sting is planned for Christ the King Infant and Junior schools. You will appreciate that we do not want to give the exact date of the next visit.

Parks Primary temporary school reopened last week (for 4+ years), school run was well observed. Contractor has to complete remedial works to the damaged footways and construct the vehicle crossing.

Traffic Regulation Orders

We have approval to advertise the one-way proposal on Tatlow Road o/s Braunstone Frith primary school, 2 x plans attached of proposals, hopefully that will be advertised this summer.

Appendix 2 – City Warden Update

There have been 10 fly tipping investigations.

Community Protection Warning Notices issued for Untidy Land and Deposit on the public highway, all have been complied with.

We have dealt with reports of littering around the Biddle Road, Pindar Road, Aikman Avenue.

At this moment unfortunately we haven't got a dedicated City Warden for Western, however we are actively trying to get this matter resolved.
