<u>The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (as amended) - Alteration Notice</u> Premises: Harveys, 43 Belvoir Street, Leicester, Leicestershire, LE1 6SL

Fire Protection Inspecting Officer, Sophie Walker, visited your premises on 03/01/2025 and evaluated the fire safety measures provided. Leicestershire Fire and Rescue Service is of the opinion that the premises may constitute a serious risk to relevant persons should the occupancy exceed 60 people on the ground floor. This Notice has been served based on the confirmation from the Responsible Person that only the ground floor of the premises is open for commercial use.

As a result of the risk from potential risk from fire, this notice requires you to inform this Authority before you make the change(s) specified below. The change(s) have been stated because they may result in a significant increase in risk in case of fire. This notice requires you to take the stated action only if you plan to make the changes.

Timescale for Completion

No timescale is associated with this notice. You must contact this Authority before making any of the stated change(s) and provide the associated information below. This notice remains in force until either it is withdrawn by this authority or cancelled by the court (subject to an appeal).

Penalty for Non-compliance





If you carry out any change(s) listed in the schedule and do not notify this authority before doing so, you will have committed an offence and this authority will consider taking legal action against you.

Route to Appeal

You can legally appeal against this notice. To do so, you must appeal by way of complaint for an order to the Magistrates court in which the premises are situated within 21 days from the date of this notice. The bringing of an appeal has the effect of suspending the operation of this notice until the appeal is finally disposed of, or until the withdrawal of the appeal.

It should be noted that in order to satisfy the Environment and Safety Information Act 1988 the Fire and Rescue Authority is obliged to enter details of any Alterations Notice into a register to which the public have access. If you feel that any such entry would disclose secret or confidential trade or manufacturing information then you should appeal in writing to the Authority within a period of fourteen days following the service of the notice.

In addition to the advice below, the schedule sets out what you need to do to improve fire safety. Taking this advice will help you to sustain those improvements.
