Highways Maintenance Works

We continue to inspect the footways and carriageways around the ward and in the last 6 months have found actionable defects as follows:

Since the last ward meeting the re-surfacing of Bennion Road, Beaumont Way and Rutherford Road has been completed.

Road Safety Schemes

We will be progressing a 20mph scheme for the Astill Lodge area in the next financial year. The Home Farm 20mph scheme should be installed and finished by early summer.

School Streets

Brook Mead Academy are building their new school and our TRO team are working with them to look at suitable School Run Parking initiatives to try and manage the parking etc at school run times on Garland Crescent.

Our Civil Enforcement Officers continue to visit all schools in the ward to discourage problem parking at school run times and issue penalty charge notices where appropriate. Previous visits are:

Appendix 3 - City Warden Update

- There have been over 17 reports of fly tips reported/investigated, and notices given this month.
- Abandoned skips have been investigated and reported for removal.
- Dog fouling reports investigated, signage placed in multiple locations, additionally, three letters have been sent to addresses giving notice revolving the occupants' dogs leaving stool in nearby gardens/footpaths.
- Additional weekly patrol within the dog fouling hotspots have occurred and will continue going forward.
- Community protection warning notices for untidy land and deposit on highways have been handed out and all have been complied to.

Contact made with landowners where hotspots for fly-tipping are taking place, both of these areas are now clear and will continue to be monitored by landowners and myself.

- Interviews have been carried out for fly tips in hot spot areas where evidence has been found, further action to take place.
- Fly posting has been targeted and retrieved; fixed penalty notices handed out to those responsible.
- Additional weekly patrol on foot and bike in all areas using tracking devices.
- Please bring any issues you are facing to the Council's attention by using the "Love Clean Streets app – Love Leicester". The app is easy to use, and you can report litter, fly-tipping, dog fouling or any other environmental problem. The advantage is that you can take a picture of the problem and upload it, tagging the location and including other details so the appropriate team can fix the issue quickly.
