Appendix A – City Warden Update

Fly-tipping

Fly tips are being investigated in the ward on a regular basis. A substantial amount of fly tips that are being investigated are consisting of bulky items which include sofas, fridges, mattresses, and other household items that could have been booked in via the free bulky waste service, all information regarding this service can be found via www.leicester.gov.uk/lovecleanstreets.

A court file has been prepared for a resident who fly tipped waste on Hawthorne Street, this will be passed to our legal team to process.

If residents do witness fly tipping, this can be reported to us along with any other issues via www.leicester.gov.uk/lovecleanstreets or via love Leicester.

Bins on streets

Tudor Road section of the ward has had bins on streets completed with 807 properties being issued with a section 46 notice, out of the 807 properties 135 Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued.

Some time this year Bassett Street section of the ward will have bins on streets carried out, I do not have a specific time frame for this now due to other wards conducting bins on street project work.

Alleyways

Alleyways are private land and are not the responsibility of Leicester City Council to clear or maintain, they are the responsibility of all residents who have access to the alleyways to clear and maintain them as well as any landlords and any managing agents.

Selective licensing and city wardens have been working together to try and tackle blocked alleyways, selective licensing can now investigate waste in alleyways where there are rented properties that share the alleyway.

Dog fouling

Dog fouling is an on-going problem around the ward, I have previously put up dog fouling signs around the ward but unfortunately these signs have been ripped down after only a couple of days. I will look at putting down some stencils. If residents know of any areas that are particularly bad for this, please let me know.

Community protection warning notices

Several community protection warning notices have been issued to residents for leaving waste/bulky items outside of their properties, very high compliance rate, where there is noncompliance further.

enforcement action is taken and can result in Fixed Penalty Notices being issued and court action may be initiated.

Commercial businesses

Duty of care checks are being carried out on businesses in the ward to ensure that businesses are disposing of their waste legally. Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued to several businesses who have not provided documentation to show where their waste is going.

Patch walk
