Appendix A - Community Safety Update

Patch walk took place at Victora Avenue in July and several agencies attended along with Cllrs Sood and Mohammed.

Several residents attended and shared concerns about overgrown trees, business waste bins, anti-social behaviour, and a lack of understanding about who owns the land as it is currently unadopted. Actions taken include:

Letters sent to all residents on how to report ASB and a dedicated ASB Officer

ASB Officer to make regular contact with residents and liaise with City Wardens and Highways in terms of ownership.

Consideration for funding for cutting back trees and possible CCTV.

Outreach and Changing Futures Teams to patrol the area where resources allow and once ownership of the area is known possible gating one side of the Avenue.

Appendix B - City Warden Update

I have been still assigned to several shifts on the PSPO in the city centre and this will be ongoing for some time.

Due to this I have very limited time to action all ward requests, and I have three wards so please bear with me on resolutions in any cases as this will take time.

However, I have been working on complaints relating to Draper Street and Rowsley Street due to fly tipping, info letters have been sent to all residents. But the issue is still happening on Rowsley Street which appears to be residential large waste, and this is even placed under the fly tipping sign on the wall.

I am also looking at waste bin reports and issues and will be actioning these again and starting the final stage of bins on streets in Stoneygate starting in September.

I appreciate that you may all feel let down and that the ward is suffering but I can assure you all that I am working tirelessly on solutions.
