Appendix A - City warden update

Fly-tipping

As I sure you are aware, fly tipping has continued to be an ongoing issue in the spinney Hill Ward, both from local residents and people emptying cars and vans onto the streets.

Unfortunately, the City Warden team, along with myself have been re-deployed into the City Centre to enforce the Public Space Protection Order on average 2-3 full days a week, leaving a huge backlog of jobs for the City Warden team to catch up with.

As a team, we are working closely with Cleansing Services and Local Housing Teams to minimise any disruption to the Wards and expedite the removal of Fly-tip from the streets.

A large percentage of the fly-tips could have originally been collected with the Free Bulky Waste Collection Service that the council provide across the city. Booking for this can be found online on the Leicester City Council website.

Educational letter drops have been used in several problematic streets, with varied success. The Environmental Crime Team have CCTV cameras and have been able to take successful enforcement action against several different people who have been fly-tipping next to the recycling area on East Park Road.

Duty of Care

Duty of care visits are underway, where all businesses will be visited in the ward, and checks will be carried out to ensure businesses are legally disposing of their waste.

Bins on streets

Residential bins left out on the street is still an on-going issue, with several streets where bins and traffic cones are being used to reserve parking spaces. If this is an issue, please either email a photo of the bin /cone to us or download the lovecleanstreets App and use that with an accurate description of where it is, and we can arrange removal of the cones and potentially issue a notice to residents leaving bins out.

Alleyways

Alleyways are private land and are not the responsibility of Leicester City Council to clear or maintain, they are the responsibility of all residents who have access to the alleyways to clear and maintain them as well as any landlords and any managing agents.

Untidy land

Where there's evidence, further investigations can be carried out but ultimately it is the responsibility of the landowners to clear their land.

Untidy gardens

Following complaints raised with the City Warden Service, several untidy gardens containing waste, have now been cleared after legal notices were issued to the owners of the properties. The City Warden Service can take enforcement action if excessive waste is being left in a garden, but if its only overgrowth, in most cases it would be a civil matter and not one for the council to enforce.

Community Protection Warning notices

Community Protection Warning notices have been issued to residents for leaving waste/furniture outside of their properties. These have a very high compliance rate, where there is non-compliance further enforcement action is taken and can result in Fixed Penalty Notices being issued and then the case being taken to court if no resolution found.

City Warden availability

As mentioned earlier, I have limited availability due to re-deployment in the City Centre for 50% of my working week, but I will do my best to investigate ay issues that arise. However, as the City Warden for Spinney Hill, Wycliffe & St Mathews I have to balance my workload between all three sites accordingly.
