	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Outline – Located in the green at the rear of the Eyres Monsell community centre. A holistic growing project, aimed at raising awareness on mental health issues. Referrals taken via GP and community groups.	
5.	Zinithiya Trust	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Outline – Charity organisation aimed at Women, families, and Children experiencing Domestic Abuse. The organisation assists with maximising income, debt management, and obtaining grants. The service includes a coffee shop, a low-cost ambient goods shop, and male Domestic Violence Signposting.	

6.	Gold Hill Adventure Playground	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Outline – Remit provision extended to include a multifunction Alternative Provision School with 167 (SEND) places available. The Food Bank remains operational delivering forty parcels a week, plus the market. The development of the Mental Health Group, now operate a Food Bank from the Gilmorton Rooms. 		
7.	Ward Community Budget	
<p>The meeting noted a Ward Funding update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ward Funding April 2024 – March 2025 - £18,000. Number of applications supported to date: 10. Spent: £8,750. Balance remaining: £9,250.
