1.	Introductions & Apologies, Declarations	
	- The meeting started and Cllrs and Officers introduced themselves. - No declarations were noted.	
2.	Cleansing / City Warden	
	- Bombay Looks on Belgrave Road - Boxes left outside were inspected, they were left on the street for cleansing to collect. - Residents suggested more litter bins to be placed near benches to prevent littering. - Belgrave Road - Paan spitting sighted, discussions around what enforcement or deterrents would be effective. (Posters have already been approved and ward funded). - Corner of Doncaster Road - Pigeon feeding prevalent; Request to put up signs with fines in English and South Asian languages – Resident request for trees to be planted in this area. - Old Police Station - Request to clear fly tipping. - Corner of Windsor Avenue - Request to CW to contact AEB to remove abandoned overflowing commercial bins. - Bombay Superstore (Old Colleseum) - Request to look into significant littering and fly tipping, owners need to be contacted to remove this. 72 vicarage lane - Fly tipping in front garden needs removing. - Flamingos on Loughborough Road - Rubbish build up outside, needs removing.	

3.	Local Policing	
Request for patrols to be increased on Belgrave Road.		
4.	Parking Enforcement	
- Belgrave Road outside Lloyds Bank - parking issues, can it be patrolled more often. - Cars stopped on double yellow lines, asked to move. - More patrols/enforcements requested to prevent illegal parking.		
5.	Housing	
- Overgrowth of bushes on land between Asra housing and Abbey Primary School, opposite Loughborough Cottages. - Resident stated they are homeless and sofa surfing, to be investigated and referred.		
6.	Highways	
- Highways, Licensing, Parking team, planning team to continue to monitor Bright Pani Puri 144 Checketts Road - Moir Street Play Area - Overgrown and derelict, Owners need to seek to find out who is responsible for maintaining the area. - Moir street Play Area – Blocked drains. 72 Melton Road – Blocked drains - Melton road outside Gohil dental practice 110 Melton Road – Blocked drains. - Loughborough road - Corner of Herbert Avenue – Bollard needs resetting. 176 Melton Road – Ground around tree needs levelling. - Car park on Vicarage Lane – A requested to look into car park to see if it could be opened up to public to create more parking.		
7.	Trees and woodland	
176 Melton Rd and Loughborough Road – Overgrown Trees. - Request for trees to be feathered along Melton Road up to Checketts Road due to overgrowth and bulging roots to reduce trip hazards. - Corner of Doncaster Road – resident requested trees to be planted in this space.		
8.	AOB	
Residents request a patch walk to cover Cossington street and the park.
