Subject: Representation/Objection to Alcohol Licence Application: One Top Store 192 Howard Road - Application For A New Premises Licence

Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to formally object to the application for a premises licence to sell alcohol at One Top Store 192 Howard Road .

As a local resident living at [REDACTED] I am extremely concerned about the impact this proposed licence will have on our local community. Specifically, the request to supply alcohol until 2:00 AM in a strictly residential area directly conflicts with the licensing objectives: **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder** and **The Prevention of Public Nuisance**.

My objections are based on the following grounds:

- **Inappropriate Hours for a Residential Area:** Operating until 2:00 AM in a neighborhood predominantly made up of homes is unacceptable. Late-night noise, traffic, and footfall at this hour will severely disturb local residents' sleep and quality of life.
- **Cumulative Impact & Existing Premises:** There is no need for an additional alcohol outlet at this location. There is already an established off-licence operating directly next door, as well as two nearby pubs. Adding another late-night off-licence creates an unnecessary concentration of alcohol outlets in a small residential space.
- **Existing Anti-Social Behaviour and Disorder:** We already experience significant disturbance in the area connected to late-night drinking from the two local pubs. People frequently congregate in the street, causing noise, littering, and anti-social behaviour. Granting a 2:00 AM alcohol licence right next to another off-licence will act as a magnet for people leaving the pubs, exacerbating street drinking, loitering, and public disorder into the early hours of the morning.

For these reasons, I strongly urge the Licensing Committee to refuse this application. At a minimum, if a licence is considered, the hours permitted for the sale of alcohol should be significantly reduced to align with standard daytime/early evening shop hours, and strict conditions should be imposed regarding security and outdoor congregation.

Please keep me updated on the progress of this application and notify me of any upcoming Licensing Sub-Committee hearing regarding this matter.

Hi Licensing,

Re: premises licence application 185491 for One Top Store at 192 Howard Road

This application is for opening hours including the supply of alcohol OFF the premises, Sunday to Thursday from 08:00 until 00:00 and Friday to Saturday from 08:00 until 02:00

On behalf of Friends of Clarendon Park I would like to **object** to this application on the grounds of:

- Prevention of public nuisance
- Prevention of crime and disorder

The terminal hours proposed are much too late for this area and would lead to disturbance of residential neighbours during the normal sleep hours of 23:00 to 07:30. By contract, the Tesco One Stop two doors away at 188 Welford Road has a premises licence LEIPRM1945 for opening hours including the sale of alcohol OFF the premises, Monday to Saturday from 07:30 to 23:00 and Sunday from 09:00 to 22:30. Also, Burgrill Leicester which sits in between these two licensed premises is open Monday to Sunday from 12:00 until 23:00. In planning terms, these three premises are not within either a Local Centre (the nearest are Queens Road and Welford Road/Gainsborough Road) or even a Neighbourhood Parade (the lowest tier of the retail hierarchy), so we would expect their opening hours to fall within the usual 07:30 to 23:00 timings.

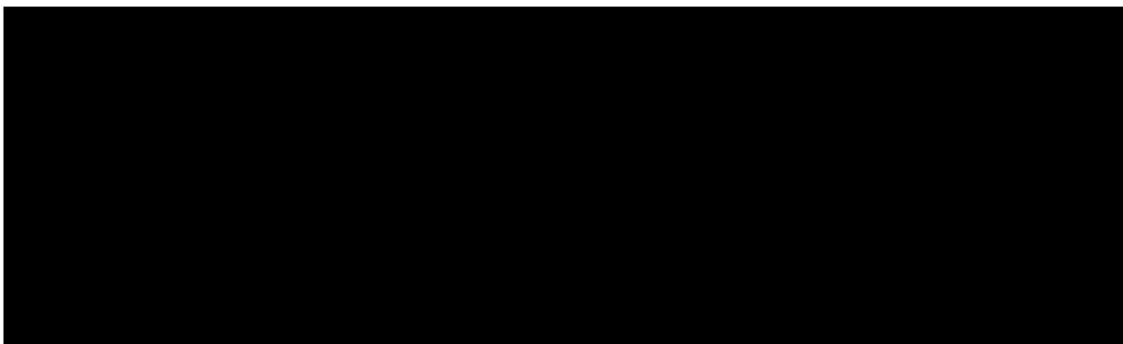


We would be willing to withdraw our objection and therefore avoid the need for a licence hearing if the applicant brought forward their terminal hours to match those of the Tesco One Stop, i.e. Monday to Saturday to 23:00 and Sunday to 22:30.

I wish to object to the premises licence application submitted for the One Top Store, 192, Howard Road, Leicester LE2 1XL

The reason for my objection is because I believe the licence would go against two of Leicester City Council licensing objectives as follows:

1. Prevention of crime and disorder - as the licensing hours would be later than any other licensed shops in the area, I believe it would attract additional people to the area late at night, leading to antisocial behaviour and possible crime and disorder.
2. The shop is on a residential street, and will attract additional vehicles and customers arriving late out night attracted from out of the area and will increase noise. This will impact residents ability to sleep, especially in the summer when bedroom windows are open.

For these reasons, to support the Council's licensing objectives I would ask that the license is not granted.

192 Howard Road One Top Store

I wish to **object** to this application - as it stands - on grounds of public nuisance and public safety.

Howard Road is primarily residential, with many families and workers. While this premises is on a corner with Welford Road, the entrance is on Howard Road. There are flats above this and neighbouring business properties. New flats are being built nearby.

The other businesses (including the licensed One Stop store and the two takeaways that adjoin) close by 11pm, some earlier. Serving alcohol after that time means people will be coming into the area at a time when people want to sleep. For example it could encourage those buying takeaways to hang around to eat them and buy more alcohol later. This can lead to noise disturbance and toilet issues, as well as rubbish. As someone living near to takeaways on Queens Road, I know how important it is not to encourage people to stay around with their food but to disperse home. Similarly it could encourage people who have already been drinking in local bars to buy more.

If the premises reduced its proposed licenced hours until 11pm it is likely that I would withdraw my objection.

Dear Licensing Team,

I am writing to formally **OBJECT** to the New Premises Licence application submitted by **ONE TOP STORE LEICESTER LTD for the sale of alcohol at 192 Howard Road, Leicester LE2 1XL.**

My objection is based on the prevention of public nuisance, the prevention of crime and disorder, and the unsuitability of the proposed operating hours for this specific residential location.

The application requests the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises from 08:00 to 00:00 Sunday through Thursday, and from 08:00 until 02:00 the next day on Fridays and Saturdays.

Allowing a premises to sell alcohol this late into the night is highly inappropriate for this area for several reasons:

1. Lack of Residential and Onsite Parking. Because there is no dedicated parking, late-night customers driving to the corner of Howard Road and Welford Road will be forced to park on residential streets. This will inevitably lead to increased traffic congestion, noise from vehicle doors and engines, and disruptions that will severely impact the quality of life and sleep of local residents during unsociable hours.

2. Late-Night Anti-Social Behaviour and Loitering. Selling alcohol until midnight during the week and 2:00 AM on weekends is completely unsuitable for a store situated on a residential street corner like Howard Road. Such late hours are likely to attract individuals who have been drinking elsewhere, creating a hotspot for late-night loitering, loud voices, and anti-social behaviour that will disturb the peace of the neighbourhood.

3. Increased Litter and Street Drinking. Because the application is strictly for the sale of alcohol for consumption OFF the premises, there is a high risk that patrons will consume their purchases in the immediate residential vicinity. This raises serious concerns about an increase in street drinking and the resulting litter, such as discarded cans and broken glass, which poses a safety hazard and degrades the local environment.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that this application for a new premises licence be **refused**.
