Premises: Dosti Restaurant and Bar, 2B Uppingham Road, Leicester

I wish to make a formal representation objecting to the application for a premises licence for Dosti Restaurant and Bar, 2B Uppingham Road, Leicester.

My objection is based on the licensing objectives of the **prevention of crime and disorder**, **prevention of public nuisance**, and **protection of children from harm**.

The area surrounding these premises already experiences significant problems associated with the sale and consumption of alcohol. There are a number of off licences operating nearby, and there is a persistent issue with groups of intoxicated individuals congregating outside local businesses, particularly around Dosti Paan House and Shiv Shakti. This regularly results in anti social behaviour, excessive noise, and frustration of local residents and passers by, and littering.

There are also ongoing concerns regarding the operation of Dosti Paan House next door. There appears to be a blatant disregard for licensing conditions, with alcohol reportedly being consumed on the premises, including upstairs, despite it operating as an off licence. This has contributed to disorder and nuisance in the immediate area.

The impact on the local community is already evident. Empty alcohol cans, bottles and broken glass are frequently discarded in the vicinity, including in the children's play area opposite the premises. This creates both a safety hazard and an unacceptable environment for families and young children using the park.

The previous premises licence granted in the area attracted substantial public objection. Despite those concerns, the licence was granted, and many of the problems predicted by local residents have since become reality. The current application risks further exacerbating these existing issues.

Of particular concern is the application to permit the sale of alcohol until **2.00 am**. Extending alcohol availability into the early hours is likely to increase late night noise, disorder, public nuisance and anti social behaviour, placing an additional burden on local residents and enforcement agencies. Given the existing problems in the area, there is no evidence that granting such late hours would promote the licensing objectives.

The locality is already saturated with premises selling alcohol, and the cumulative effect is having a detrimental impact on residents' quality of life. Granting another licence, particularly one allowing alcohol sales until 2.00 am, would significantly worsen an already unacceptable situation.

For these reasons, I respectfully request that the Licensing Sub Committee refuses this application for sale of alcohol to minimise the impact on local residents and uphold the licensing objectives.
