(b) A condition that the licensee will ensure that CCTV is installed following advice from the Leicestershire Constabulary Crime Reduction Officer and maintained in

recommendations from the Crime Reduction Officer. This can prevent as well as detect crime.)

- (c) A condition be added that the licensee will adopt the Challenge 21 policy and provide adequate, documented training for staff (paid or unpaid) before they are allowed to serve alcohol. This training will be repeated every three months, in order to retain focus, and records of that training will be provided to Council licensing officers and police on request.
- (d) A condition be added that the current Designated Premises Supervisor will obtain a recognised qualification for Designated Premises Supervisors. These courses focus on the role and responsibilities of the DPS above and beyond the syllabus for the level 2 National Certificate for Personal Licence Holders. The Licence holder must provide the licensing authority with sight of the certificate within the next 3 months.
- (e) A condition be added that no alcohol will be sold unless the container bears a label identifying the store from which it was sold. (This will assist the responsible authorities in identifying the source of recovered alcohol and containers.)

This condition is one of those suggested in the recent letter sent to all licensing authorities by Gerry Sutcliffe, the Licensing Minister at the DCMS.
