# Leicester City Council Scrutiny Review

# Scoping Document for completion by Members



## **Background to scrutiny reviews**

Not every request for a scrutiny review can be met. Getting the right topics for scrutiny reviews is the first step in making sure scrutiny provides benefits to the Council and the community.

The attached scoping template has been designed to assist in thinking through the purpose of a review. This scoping document needs to be completed by the member proposing the review. In most instances this will be the relevant scrutiny Task Group Leader. Where it is not from a Task Group Leader it makes sense for that relevant Task Group Leader to be consulted during preparation of this scoping document. It is the Task Group Leader who will be expected to lead on any topic under their remit, and it is the Task Group Leader who will be subject to monitoring from OSMB. Under their leadership the task group is responsible for interviewing witnesses, engaging service users and the public where appropriate, and for drafting the review report and recommendations.

As manager of the task groups, OSMB will ultimately determine whether a scrutiny review will go ahead based on a number of considerations. Part of that consideration will be the current workload of the respective task group. The greater part of that consideration will be based upon the successful completion of this scoping document. Proposals with the potential for high **impact** stand the best chance of being taken up.

In order to be effective, every scrutiny review must be properly project managed. This is to make sure that the review achieves its aims and has measurable outcomes. One of the most important ways to make sure that a review goes well is to ensure that it is well defined at the outset. This way the review is less likely to get sidetracked or be overambitious in what it hopes to tackle. The task group's objectives should, therefore, be as SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic & Time-bound) as possible.

A good scoping template is also a great communication tool in helping others to understand what the inquiry is about and will be subject to publication on the Leicester City Council website.

This template includes a section for the Department to complete to allow OSMB to consider any additional factors that may influence the proposed review.

### **Evaluation**

Reviewing changes that have been made as a result of a scrutiny review is the most common way of assessing effectiveness. This will, in part, be done through the Scrutiny Annual Report which is produced yearly and which will include departmental feedback on which, if any, recommendations from task group reports have been taken forward as well as providing an explanation where they have not been implemented. However, any scrutiny review should consider whether an on-going monitoring role for the task group is appropriate to the topic under review.

## **ROUGH SLEEPERS IN LEICESTER**

Proposed by Councillor Agbany, Adults & Housing Task Group Leader

## **Rationale**

In May 2010 the Government announced that it would bring in a new counting method by 2011 which would better reflect the true scale of the rough sleepers' problem.

In response to review topics put forward by non-exec members, Osmb in June 2010 suggested that this topic to be investigated by the Adults & Housing Task Group.

- 1) The government is proposing changes to guidance on evaluating the extent of rough sleeping.
- 2) This issue has been raised as an area of concern by the public.
- 3) This issue has attracted public interest and media interest.

Currently, a survey of rough sleepers is conducted once a year in some cities, but homeless charities have long argued that the count underestimates the true scale of the problem.

This service is funded through Leicester Partnership Area Based Grant which, overall, is going to be reduced.

Departmental Comments on the proposed review

The Rough Sleepers Outreach Team, based at the Dawn Centre checks for rough sleepers throughout the week and keeps a weekly record of named rough sleepers. The Team works with individuals to resolve their homelessness which often means arranging for them to come into a hostel in council or voluntary sector. There are currently 22 rough sleepers in the city the numbers have risen over last 2 years. There are a number of issues to consider relating to rough sleepers. the review may wish to focus on the reasons for rough sleeping in Leicester, the services available (both LCC and voluntary sector) and the associated issues rather than the recent changes in government data collection.
