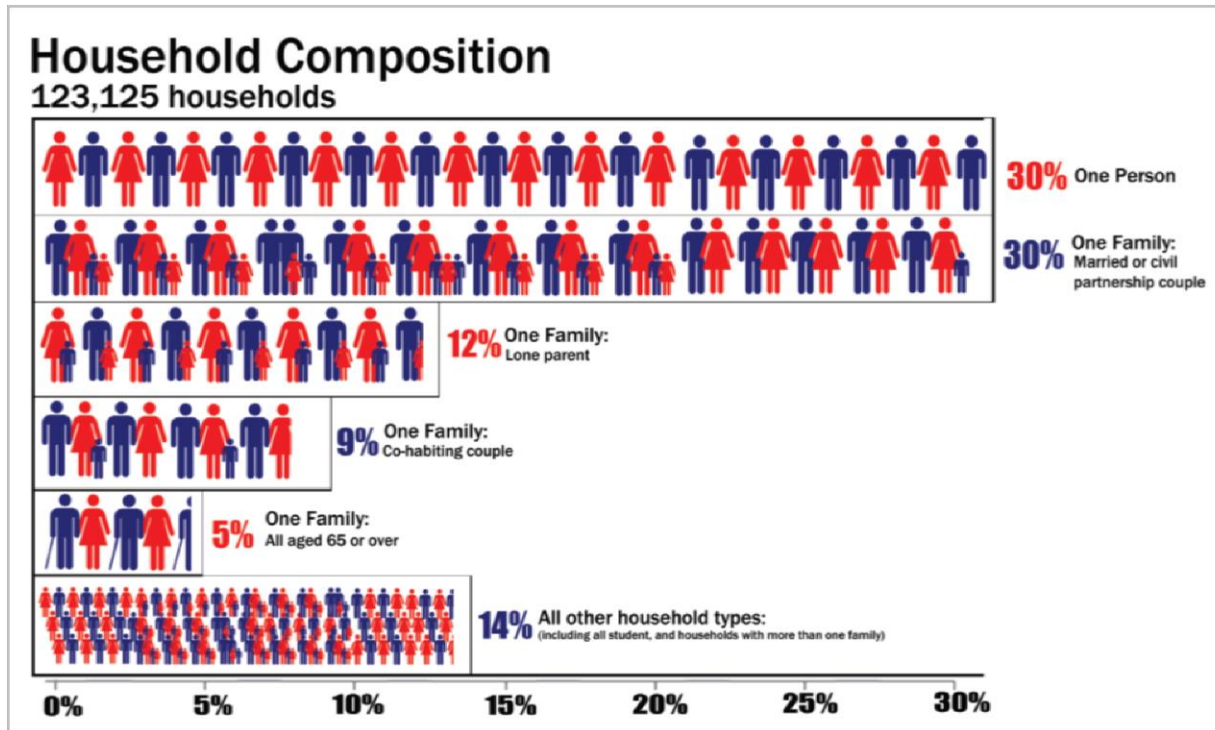


# Compendium of key statistics

# Leicester

The historic core of the City dates back to Celtic and Roman times and includes one of England's finest medieval guildhalls.

It is the commercial, governmental and cultural centre with a large shopping centre, Highcross, market and theatre, Curve.

This area also includes the campuses of the city's two universities and the area known as Clarendon Park.

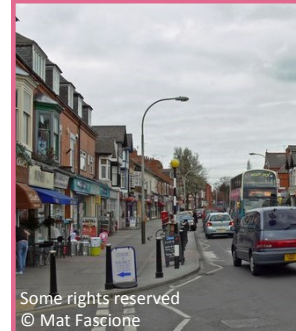

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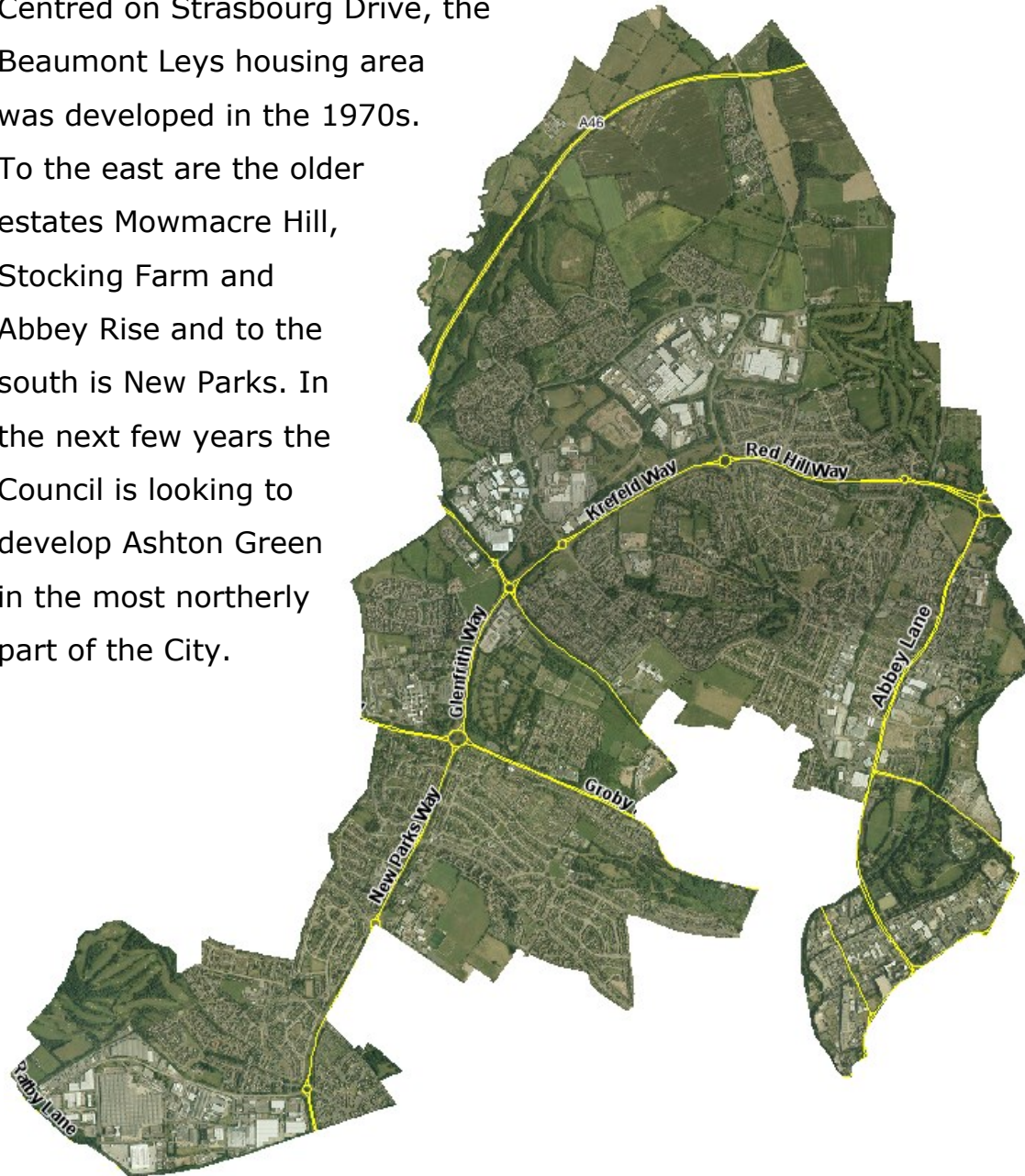

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Centred on Strasbourg Drive, the Beaumont Leys housing area was developed in the 1970s. To the east are the older estates Mowmacre Hill, Stocking Farm and Abbey Rise and to the south is New Parks. In the next few years the Council is looking to develop Ashton Green in the most northerly part of the City.

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This area encompasses of the suburbs either side of the Midland Main Line, including the Northfields and Tailby estates. Along Belgrave and Melton Road lies the Golden Mile shopping district. To the north east of the old village of Humberstone, the Hamilton estate has been the subject of much recent development.

Including the old village and much of the former parish of Evington, this area stretches from the eastern edge of the city centre to the boundary with Harborough. It includes redevelopment areas such as St Matthews and St Peters and one of the last greenfield estates built in the City, Thurnby Lodge. To the east of the railway station are some of the city's oldest suburbs, including the district known as Highfields.

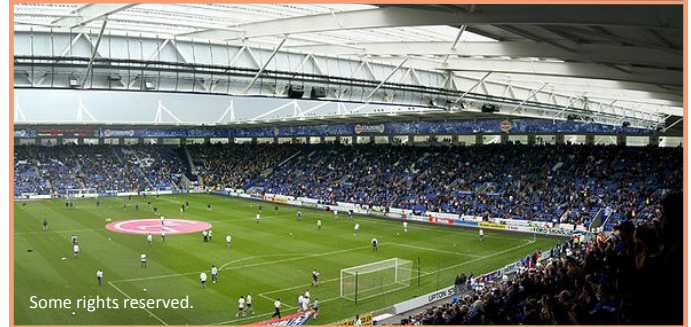
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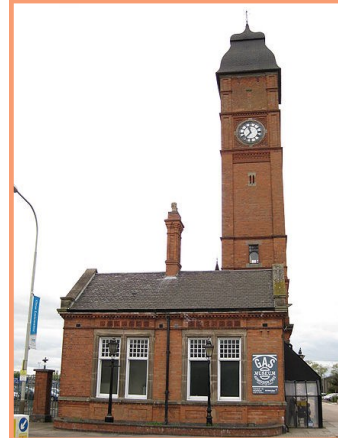

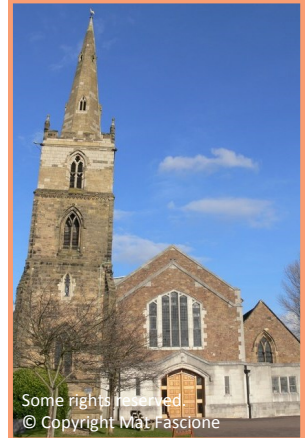

This area comprises an inner core of terraced housing of a variety of sizes with a periphery of Council estates. The Braunstone estate was built in the 1920s/30s and adopted the fashion of the garden city movement in its design, with the result that it is a very spacious development. This contrasts with the much higher density inner area variously named the West End, Newfoundpool, Danes Hill and Fosse.

## Definitions

2011 output census data	Definition
Overcrowded	A household is defined as overcrowded if there are fewer rooms than required. The number of rooms required is based on a standard formula.
Unemployment rate	A person aged 16-74 is defined as unemployed if he or she is not in employment, is available to start work in the next two weeks and has either looked for work in the last four weeks or is waiting to start a new job.  The unemployment rate is the proportion of the economically active 16-74 year olds who are unemployed.

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
