#### **Report of the Director of Environmental Services**

### 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.


#### 2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
  - Grant the licence without modification
  - Grant the licence subject to conditions
  - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
  - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
  - Reject the application

#### 3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for Unit 22, 33 Cank Street and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

## 5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 6 January 2014 from Mr Kalpesh Ruparell for a new premises licence for Unit 22, 33 Cank Street, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.

## 6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section P of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

#### 7. Live Music

- 7.1 The Live Music Act 2012 has amended the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the provision of live music. Unamplified live music does not require a licence between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day. Amplified music may be provided between 08.00 and 23.00 hours each day if:
  - it is provided in a premises licensed and open for the sale of alcohol, to an audience of not more than 200 people; or
  - it is provided in a premises that is not licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 (other than solely for late night refreshment) but that is a workplace, to an audience of not more than 200 people.
- 7.2 The above exemptions may affect the application under consideration because conditions may not be imposed at this stage to control live music provided in the circumstances described above. However, if problems do occur as a result of live music then conditions may be imposed to control that music following the formal review process.

## 8. Representation

8.1 A representation was received on 15 January 2014 from Leicestershire Police. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder and the protection of children from harm. Leicestershire Police are concerned that the premises is situated between two very busy areas and will attract through traffic. Leicestershire Police have contacted the applicant to request additional conditions to be applied to the licence A copy of the representation and agreement is attached is attached at Appendix B1.

8.2 Another representation was received on 6 February 2014 from a member of the public. The representation relates to prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance. The representee is concerned that the unit is sited at the arched gateway to St Martins and is worried that groups of people will congregate in this area. A copy of this representation is attached at Appendix B2.

#### 9. Conditions

9.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.

## 10. Statutory Guidance
