1. Purpose of Report


1.1. This report provides information for Members about an objection notice received in relation to a temporary event notice (TEN) given under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome.

2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the temporary event notice and the objection notice, Members must consider whether to
 - Give the premises user a counter notice under Section 105 (2) of the Licensing Act 2003 if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of a licensing objective to do so; or
 - Disregard the objection notice

3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an objection notice given by the Noise Team in response to a temporary event notice given by Mr. Sturgess for Hughies Café, 57 Humberstone Gate, Leicester. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.



- 5. Temporary event notice
- 5.1. A temporary event notice was given on 19th March 2014 by Mr Sturgess for an event at Hughies Café. The temporary event notice is for an event on 4th May 2014 and is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2. The temporary event notice is for the following licensable activities:

| Licensable activities | Proposed hours |
|---|----------------|
| The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises | 13:00 – 21:30 |
| Provision of regulated entertainment | 13:00 – 21:30 |

6. Objection notice

6.1 An objection notice was received on 20th March 2014 from the Noise Team on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. The Noise Team are concerned that residents may be disturbed by noise from the event. A copy of the objection notice is attached at Appendix B.

7. Existing premises licence

7.1 There is no premises licence that affects any part of the premises identified in the temporary event notice. This means that no conditions may be applied to the temporary event notice.

8. Statutory Guidance

8.1 Any decision made by the Licensing Authority must be in accordance with the licensing objectives. In addition, the government has issued guidance under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The relevant parts of the guidance in this case are as follows:
