Representation

I wish to make representation in connection with this application for a temporary event notice (TEN) for an extension to a licensable activity as I consider this proposal will be detrimental to the licensing objective of public nuisance.

REASONS

The premise is a restaurant situated towards the end of a row of mixed commercial properties and there are a number of residential properties within close proximity opposite and to the side of the premises.

The applicant has applied for a Temporary Event Notice to extend the opening of the premises for the sale of late night refreshment from 23.00 hours until 03.30 hours for 7 consecutive days (27th July 2014 till 4th July 2014).

The applicant indicates that the intention for the Temporary Event Notice is for the serving of food during the first seven days of Ramadan.

I appreciate that Ramadan is a period of religious fasting during which, followers may eat only between sunset and sunrise. However I am concerned that it will be very difficult to prevent noise from customers using the premises affecting residential properties for the extended period requested even though the request is for the sale of food only. I am also mindful that Ramadan lasts for a period of 30 days (27th July 2014) and this request is for the first seven day period of Ramadan.

Noise from customer vehicles, customers arriving, leaving and using the outside of the premises until 03.30 hours daily (especially during the weekdays) will affect numerous residential properties near to and around the premises therefore there is an increased likelihood of sleep disruption and complaint.

I am of the opinion that it will be very difficult for the applicant to implement sufficient control to protect nearby residents and request that this application be refused.
