## Report of the Director of Neighbourhood and Environmental Services

## 1. Purpose of Report

1.1. This report provides information for Members about an application made under the Licensing Act 2003, to assist them in determining the outcome of that application.

## 2. Determination to be made

- 2.1. Having considered the application and representations, Members must consider whether to
  - Grant the licence without modification
  - Grant the licence subject to conditions
  - Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities
  - Refuse to accept the proposed premises supervisor
  - Reject the application

## 3. Summary

3.1 This report outlines an application for a new premises licence for "Green Lane Fruit & Veg" and summarises the representations received. It also highlights the licensing objectives, the relevant parts of the guidance and regulations, and the pertinent sections of the Licensing Authority's Licensing Policy.

# 5. Application

- 5.1 An application was received on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2018 from Mr Mayur Lakhanshi Modhwadia for a new premises licence for 42-44 Green Lane Road, Leicester. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix A.
- 5.2 The application is as follows:

# 6. Steps to Promote the Licensing Objectives

- 6.1 The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (see section 18 of Appendix A).
- 6.2 In arriving at its decision on the application, the Licensing Authority's primary consideration must be the promotion of the licensing objectives.

## 7. Representation

- 7.1 A representation was received on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> May 2018 from a local resident in the form of a petition signed by seventy three local residents. The representation relates to the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public nuisance and public safety. The residents are concerned that grant of the licence will add to existing noise and alcohol related disturbances in the area. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix B1.
- 7.2 A petition in support of the application was received on Tuesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2018 from the applicant. A copy of the petition is attached at Appendix B2.

#### 8. Conditions

8.1 The conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule and the representation are attached at Appendix C.
